Joyce Byers, (née Horowitz), portrayed by Winona Ryder, is a major protagonist of Stranger Things. The financially struggling single mother of Jonathan and Will Byers, Joyce is also a long-time friend of Jim Hopper.



## **DAVID HARBOUR as Jim Hopper**

James 'Jim' Hopper, portrayed by David Harbour, is a major protagonist of Stranger Things. Chief of Police of the town of Hawkins, Indiana. Haunted by a troubled past.



## **FINN WOLFHARD as Mike Wheeler**

Michael 'Mike' Wheeler, portrayed by Finn Wolfhard, is one of the main protagonists of Stranger Things. The leader of the Party, he is the boyfriend of Eleven, the best friend of Dustin Henderson, Lucas Sinclair, and Will Byers. The younger brother of Nancy Wheeler.



## **MILLIE BOBBY BROWN as Eleven**

Jane "El" Hopper (born Jane Ives), better known as Eleven, is one of the main protagonists of Stranger Things. Her character is portrayed by Millie Bobby Brown. Eleven was kidnapped and raised in Hawkins National Laboratory, where she was experimented on for her inherited psychokinetic abilities. Later adopted by Jim Hopper.



# **GATEN MATARAZZO as Dustin Henderson**

Dustin Henderson, portrayed by Gaten Matarazzo, is a main character in Stranger Things. He is the best friend of Mike Wheeler, Eleven, Lucas Sinclair, Will Byers, and Steve Harrington. Has a rare genetic disorder (cleidocranial dysplasia) that prevents his teeth from developing properly.



## **CALEB McLAUGHLIN as Lucas Sinclair**

Lucas Charles Sinclair, portrayed by Caleb McLaughlin is a major protagonist of Stranger Things. He is best friends with Mike Wheeler, Dustin Henderson, Will Byers, and Eleven.



## **NATALIA DYER as Nancy Wheeler**

Nancy Wheeler, portrayed by Natalia Dyer, is one of the main characters of Stranger Things. She is the older sister of Mike Wheeler, the current girlfriend of Steve Harrington. Her best friend is Barbara Holland.



## **CHARLIE HEATON as Jonathan Byers**

Jonathan Byers, portrayed by Charlie Heaton, is a main character in Stranger Things. He is the oldest son of Joyce Byers, the older brother of Will Byers.



## **JOE KEERY as Steve Harrington**

Steve Harrington, portrayed by Joe Keery, is a major character of Stranger Things. A student at Hawkins High School, popular jock, and boyfriend of Nancy Wheeler.



## **NOAH SCHNAPP as Will Byers**

William 'Will' Byers, portrayed by Noah Schnapp, is a main character in Stranger Things. He is the younger son of Joyce Byers, the younger brother of Jonathan Byers, and the best friend of Mike Wheeler, Eleven, Dustin Henderson, and Lucas Sinclair. Abducted by a creature that he and his friends would later dub the "Demogorgon" and taken into an alternate dimension (The Upside Down).



## **MATTHEW MODINE as Dr. Martin Brenner**

Dr. Martin Brenner, portrayed by Matthew Modine. Works for the US Department of Energy as a senior research scientist and the director of Hawkins National Laboratory. He has a major role in various controversial experiments, including Project MKUltra.



## **SHANNON PURSER as Barbara Holland**


Barbara Holland, more commonly referred to as Barb, is a recurring character in the first season of Stranger Things. She is the best friend of Nancy Wheeler.


