James 'Jim' Hopper, portrayed by David Harbour, is a major protagonist in Stranger Things. Chief of Police of the town of Hawkins, Indiana. Officially adopted Eleven with the help of Dr. Sam Owens.



FINN WOLFHARD as Mike Wheeler

Michael 'Mike' Wheeler, portrayed by Finn Wolfhard, is one of the main protagonists in Stranger Things. The leader of the Party, he is the boyfriend of Eleven, the best friend of Dustin Henderson, Lucas Sinclair, Will Byers, and Max Mayfield. The younger brother of Nancy Wheeler.



MILLIE BOBBY BROWN as Eleven

Jane "El" Hopper (born Jane Ives), better known as Eleven, is one of the main protagonists in Stranger Things. Her character is portrayed by Millie Bobby Brown. Eleven was kidnapped and raised in Hawkins National Laboratory, where she was experimented on for her inherited psychokinetic abilities. Adopted by Jim Hopper.



GATEN MATARAZZO as Dustin Henderson

Dustin Henderson, portrayed by Gaten Matarazzo, is a main character in Stranger Things. He is the best friend of Mike Wheeler, Eleven, Lucas Sinclair, Will Byers, Steve Harrington, and Max Mayfield. Has a rare genetic disorder (cleidocranial dysplasia) that prevents his teeth from developing properly.



CALEB McLAUGHLIN as Lucas Sinclair

Lucas Charles Sinclair, portrayed by Caleb McLaughlin is a major protagonist in Stranger Things. He is best friends with Mike Wheeler, Dustin Henderson, Will Byers, Eleven, and Max Mayfield.



NATALIA DYER as Nancy Wheeler

Nancy Wheeler, portrayed by Natalia Dyer, is one of the main characters in Stranger Things. She is the older sister of Mike Wheeler, the eventual girlfriend of Jonathan Byers.



CHARLIE HEATON as Jonathan Byers

Jonathan Byers, portrayed by Charlie Heaton, is a main character in Stranger Things. He is the oldest son of Joyce Byers, the older brother of Will Byers. The eventual boyfriend of Nancy Wheeler.



JOE KEERY as Steve Harrington

Steve Harrington, portrayed by Joe Keery, is a major character in Stranger Things. A student at Hawkins High School, popular jock. Best. Babysitter. Ever.

Older stepbrother of Max Mayfield. Echoes the physical and emotional abuse from his father in his behaviour toward Max and her friends.
