# **DAVID HARBOUR as Jim Hopper**

James 'Jim' Hopper, portrayed by David Harbour, is a major protagonist in Stranger Things. Chief of Police of the town of Hawkins, Indiana.



### FINN WOLFHARD as Mike Wheeler

Michael 'Mike' Wheeler, portrayed by Finn Wolfhard, is one of the main protagonists in Stranger Things. The leader of the Party, he is the boyfriend of Eleven, the best friend of Dustin Henderson, Lucas Sinclair, Will Byers, and Max Mayfield. The younger brother of Nancy Wheeler.



## **MILLIE BOBBY BROWN as Eleven**

Jane "El" Hopper (born Jane Ives), better known as Eleven, is one of the main protagonists in Stranger Things. Her character is portrayed by Millie Bobby Brown. Eleven was kidnapped and raised in Hawkins National Laboratory, where she was experimented on for her inherited psychokinetic abilities. Hopper's adopted daughter.



### **GATEN MATARAZZO as Dustin Henderson**

Dustin Henderson, portrayed by Gaten Matarazzo, is a main character in Stranger Things. He is the best friend of Mike Wheeler, Eleven, Lucas Sinclair, Will Byers, Steve Harrington, and Max Mayfield. Current boyfriend of Suzie, whom he met at "Camp Know Where."



### **CALEB McLAUGHLIN as Lucas Sinclair**

Lucas Charles Sinclair, portrayed by Caleb McLaughlin is a major protagonist in Stranger Things. He is best friends with Mike Wheeler, Dustin Henderson, Will Byers, and Eleven. Current boyfriend of Max Mayfield...but has been dumped 5-times already.



# **NATALIA DYER as Nancy Wheeler**

Nancy Wheeler, portrayed by Natalia Dyer, is one of the main characters in Stranger Things. She is the older sister of Mike Wheeler, girlfriend of Jonathan Byers. Works at The Hawkins Post. Wants to be a journalist.



# **CHARLIE HEATON as Jonathan Byers**

Jonathan Byers, portrayed by Charlie Heaton, is a main character in Stranger Things. He is the oldest son of Joyce Byers, the older brother of Will Byers. Nancy's boyfriend. Works at The Hawkins Post as a photographer.



# **JOE KEERY as Steve Harrington**

Steve Harrington, portrayed by Joe Keery, is a major character in Stranger Things. Works at Starcourt Mall, slinging ice-cream for Scoops Ahoy.



# **NOAH SCHNAPP as Will Byers**

William 'Will' Byers, portrayed by Noah Schnapp, is a main character in Stranger Things. He is the younger son of Joyce Byers, the younger brother of Jonathan Byers, and the best friend of Mike Wheeler, Eleven, Dustin Henderson, Lucas Sinclair, and Max Mayfield.



# **SADIE SINK as Max Mayfield**

Maxine "Max" Mayfield, portrayed by Sadie Sink, is a major character in Stranger Things. Lives with her stepfather, Neil Hargrove, and her brother, Billy Hargrove. Girlfriend of Lucas Sinclair. Eleven's best friend and life-coach.



## **DACRE MONTGOMERY as Billy Hargrove**

William 'Billy' Hargrove, portrayed by Dacre Montgomery, is a major character in Stranger Things. Works as a lifeguard at Hawkins Community Pool. Primary rival to Steve Harrington. Older stepbrother of Max Mayfield. Enjoys teasing and seducing the older women at the pool.



### CARA BUONO as Karen Wheeler

Karen Wheeler, portrayed by Cara Buono, is a recurring character in Stranger Things. She is the loving but naive mother of Nancy, Mike, and Holly, and the wife of Ted. Considering ruining her marriage for a night with Billy Hargrove.



### PRIAH FERGUSON as Erica Sinclair

Erica Sinclair, portrayed by Priah Ferguson, is a main character in Stranger Things. She is the younger sister of Lucas Sinclair. Sassy and smart. May or may not be a nerd.



# **MAYA HAWKE as Robin Buckley**

Robin Buckley, portrayed by Maya Hawke, is a main character in Stranger Things. She is the co-worker (Scoops Ahoy) and best friend of Steve Harrington. Sarcastic, funny, very intelligent.



## **BRETT GELMAN as Murray Bauman**

Murray Bauman, portrayed by Brett Gelman, is a main character in Stranger Things. Former investigative reporter. Conspiracy theorist. Speaks fluent Russian.



## **CARY ELWES as Mayor Larry Kline**

Larry Kline, portrayed by Cary Elwes, is a main character in Stranger Things. Corrupt Mayor of Hawkins. Works closely with Russian operatives. Approved the construction of Starcourt Mall with a secret Soviet bunker underground.

Bruce, portrayed by Jake Busey. Chauvinistic, misogynistic. Believes that a woman's place is in the kitchen. Works at The Hawkins Post as a reporter. Picks on Nancy Wheeler constantly.
