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ELLIOT PAGE AS VIKTOR HARGREEVES

Viktor was relegated to No. 7 in the Umbrella Academy after Hargreeves used medication to suppress his incredible ability to convert sound into powerful blasts of energy. After almost destroying the world twice, he's discovered his true self and his power.



TOM HOPPER AS LUTHER HARGREEVES

Luther was already superstrong when Sir Reginald saved his life with a serum that gave him a body like a gorilla, something Luther hides by wearing gloves and long sleeves. Reginald then sent Luther on a lonely and pointless mission to the moon. While he's not really a great leader, Luther has a big heart.



DAVID CASTAÑEDA AS DIEGO HARGREEVES

Diego can manipulate the trajectory of moving objects, which he uses to throw knives with perfect accuracy. He takes his job as a superhero very seriously, becoming a vigilante after the Umbrella Academy disbanded. When the family was trapped in 1963 Dallas, Diego became obsessed with preventing the assassination of JFK. That landed him in a mental institution, where he met and fell in love with Lila, an agent of the Temps Commission who also has extraordinary powers.



EMMY RAVER-LAMPMAN AS VIKTOR ALLISON

Allison has the power to control the thoughts and behaviors of others just by speaking the phrase "I heard a rumor." Allison used her powers on both her husband, Patrick, and their daughter, Claire; when Patrick found out, he divorced her and took full parental custody. Allison remarried while trapped in 1961 Dallas, where she became a civil rights activist, but left that life behind to return to the present.



ROBERT SHEEHAN AS KLAUS HARGREEVES

Klaus has the power to see and speak with the dead, and he's long tried to ignore them by abusing drugs and alcohol, feeding his habit by stealing from his father. Last season revealed that Klaus' ability is even more powerful than he originally realized: He can physically manifest ghosts to protect him or fight on his behalf.



AIDAN GALLAGHER AS FIVE

Five disappeared soon after the team made its first public appearance. He had used his ability to manipulate space-time to travel to a postapocalyptic future, where he remained stranded for decades until he was recruited as a Temps Commission assassin. He disobeyed their orders and attempted to prevent the apocalypse, but the unstable time travel led to him appearing in his teenage body. That doesn't stop him from spending plenty of time drinking and belittling his siblings.



JUSTIN H. MIN AS BEN A.K.A. #2

This is not the sweet Ben we know and love. This Ben is a Machiavellian tactician, wrapped up in a pretty-boy body with a rumbling inner squid. Vicious, pragmatic and hypervigilant, Ben is determined to gain his status as the leader at all costs.



RITU ARYA AS LILA PITTS

Lila Pitts was a fellow patient at the psychiatric institution that Diego found himself in when he is transported back in time. The two made quick friends and planned an escape together, which ended up being successful... sort of.



GENESIS RODRIGUEZ AS SLOANE A.K.A. #5

Sloane is a romantic and a dreamer who feels a higher cosmic calling, leaving her eager to see the world and experience a life beyond her upbringing. But obligations to her family keep Sloane tethered to the Sparrow Academy, as does her fear of crossing the family line. But Sloane has plans — and one day she might just be brave enough to act on them.



BRITNE OLDFORD AS FEI A.K.A. #3

Fei sees the world in a special way. She comes across as a misanthrope who would rather be alone than spend even a second with anyone. But truth be told, Fei wishes she had a friend. Most of the time, Fei is the smartest person in the room and willing to work things out. But if you cross her, there's no looking back, because Fei won't stop until the job is done.



ADAM GODLEY AS VOICE OF POGO

Doctor Phinneus Pogo was an advanced chimpanzee, assistant, and friend of the Umbrella Academy family. He was killed by the White Violin trying to protect Number Five. But that was another time.



COLM FEORE AS REGINALD HARGREEVES

Sir Reginald Hargreeves, also known as The Monocle, is an alien disguised as a wealthy entrepreneur and world-renowned scientist. He adopts the members of The Umbrella Academy at birth. Inventor of the Televator, the Levitator, the Mobile Umbrella Communicator, and Clever Crisp Cereal.



JUSTIN CORNWELL AS MARCUS A.K.A. #1

Marcus is a charming, chiseled colossus. Honest, virtuous and demanding, Marcus keeps the family together. Graceful but lethal, calculated but compassionate, he is as smart as he is strong. Marcus is disciplined, rational and in control. He oozes confidence and leadership without ever having to raise his voice.



JAKE EPSTEIN AS ALPHONSO A.K.A. #4

Years of crime fighting have left Alphonso's face and body with countless visual reminders of his battles. To compensate, Alphonso is armed with a caustic and biting sense of humor. The only things he likes better than verbally battering anyone foolish enough to get in his face are a good pizza and a six-pack of beer.



CAZZIE DAVID AS JAYME A.K.A. #6

Jayme is a loner hidden under a hoodie. She doesn't say much because she doesn't have to. Jayme has a fear-inducing snarl. Catch a glimpse of it, and you'll run across the street to avoid what follows. Smart and as sharp as a knife, she spends most of her time hanging with Alphonso, her only friend.



PSYKRONIUM CUBE AS CHRISTOPHER A.K.A. #7
